PLEASE: Pick up after your pet! *Ordinance 3-1-24 States No keeper or owner of any cat or dog shall allow the animal to defecate on private or public property other than their own. If a cat or dog does defecate upon private or public property, then the keeper or owner of the cat or dog must immediately and thoroughly clean the fecal material from such property.*

GOLF CARTS



Any person operating a golf cart shall obtain a permit from the City Finance Office to operate the golf cart on municipal streets each year. Proof must be provided that the golf cart is insured for liability and the person operating the golf cart must have a valid driver's license. A permit must be obtained for a fee of \$10.00.

Leo Tolstoy stated: "Spring is the time of plans and projects." This quote rings true for us at the Clear Lake City Library! Here's a synopsis of what we've been up to:

- ◆ In February, we restarted our Story Time on the Road program. Each month we take story time on the road to five local daycares as well as the Preschool and Junior Kindergarten classes.
- ◆ Every other Wednesday at 11:00, we deliver books to our patrons at Hidewood Estates.
- ◆ Each Friday, we host a "Friday Funday" program from 1 – 4. During the afternoon, we have story times, crafts, and activities for children of all ages.
- ◆ At the beginning of the year, a Mentorship program was started at the library. Each young person enrolled in this program volunteers at the library for a couple of hours at a time. During each "shift," we teach positive job skills and employee qualities, the inner workings of the library, and the value of reading.

In addition to the above-mentioned programs, the library has a terrific selection of books, audiobooks, and DVDs for all ages, as well as projectors, portable DVD and CD players, board games, disc golf sets, and tool kits available for checkout. Public computers are always available for library use, as are services for printing, copying, faxing, and laminating. We also have a Makerspace outfitted with crafting supplies and gadgets along with a variety of STEAM toys.

The 2023 Utility Rates are as follows:

- * Water: \$21.40 base per month + \$7.80 per 1,000 gallons
- * Sewer: \$48.15 per month (no change)
- * Garbage: \$15.50 per month

CURB & GUTTER REBATE EXTENDED:

- You now have until Aug. 1, 2024 to install new curb and gutter and get a rebate of up to \$13/linear foot back, once the contractor's bill is paid.
- You can use any contractor to install it and some may offer better pricing if neighbors install it too at the same time. The City will pay for the engineering of the project, but will not contact the contractors.
- REMINDER—if you take anything out, whether it's old curb & gutter or a sidewalk, it must be replaced with new, and it must be included in your building permit. *Only New Curb & Gutter install will be reimbursed*
